



## CULTURAL AMBASSADOR PARTICIPATION INFORMATION PACKAGE

The Embracing Differences Committee is delivering its 5<sup>th</sup> year of programming in 2023/24 to nearly 80 Grades 5-8 classrooms! Since its inception, Embracing Differences has served nearly 7500 students and their teachers who have had the opportunity to meet with and learn from up to six RMC Cultural Ambassadors.

## Background:

This project is supported by both Regina School Divisions. Being a Cultural Ambassador is a unique opportunity for your organization to:

- be represented and recognised in the community.
- have an ongoing presence and voice regarding your culture in participating classrooms.
- provide accurate information about your culture, traditions, and customs.
- promote your cultural community and programming throughout the year including your Pavilion!
- give students of your culture a sense of pride in their identity and heritage reflected in classroom learning.
- help students of other cultural origins understand your culture and be more culturally sensitive.

## Become a Cultural Ambassador:

- Honorarium is paid and the cost of materials for crafts (if applicable) is covered by ED project fund.
- Cultural Ambassador applications must be received as soon as possible for this project year.
- We will follow up with each inquiry or application received.
- Cultural Ambassadors may participate as schedules allow; the sessions are offered during the school day (9-12 & 12:30 – 3:30).
- Restricted, limited, and open schedules are welcome and can be considered.
- We provide session planning support for each new Ambassador session to support success.
- Each class is anticipated to receive up to 4 different Ambassadors/sessions between October and May; possibly more if resources permit.
- Sessions are approximately 60-75 minutes; the same session can be offered repeatedly by an Ambassador to assigned classrooms.
- More than one Cultural Ambassador from a given cultural community is welcome.
- Cultural teachings may include content such as etiquette, games, crafts, storytelling/folk tales, wedding customs, festivals, symbolism in artforms, etc. There is a wide variety of cultural experiences and topics that can support learning and interests of 10 to 14-year-old students.
- In short, we seek to provide students (and teachers) with information and a memorable interactive experience about your culture that will prepare them for future interactions with potential friends or community events involving your culture.
